2023-2024 BOARD PRESIDENT ANNUAL REPORT

As we finalize our year end, I'm grateful to write this report while working on the traditional, unceded territory of the Ts'msyen nation, particularly the Kitselas and Kistumkalum peoples.

This year, the Terrace Peaks Gymnastics Club Society had many successes. We have continued to increase programming, both in our recreational programs (adding classes like Parkour and Acro) and also with the resurgence of our competitive programming. We have increased access to the gym through funding with Jordan's Principle, Engage Sport North, and iSparc. We have also been able to invest \$105,000 back into the club for much needed equipment including a new trampoline, upgrades to our computer security systems and hardware, class supplies and more.

A major Board priority this year has been working on establishing clear policies. You'll see this in our discussion of the new bylaws we are bringing forward to the membership. We have made sure that we work within the Gymnastics BC guidelines, while also creating policy that reflects the club's mission and vision. However, this policy work also extended to adding benefits for employees working 20+ hours per week, and ensuring competitive wages in line with the industry and with the skills our team brings. We have been able to support multiple staff members through training this year too, which enables more programming options in the community. In addition, we continued our relationship with the Regional District of Kitimat & Stikine, ensuring direct support of the club for years to come, as well as for our eventual phase 3 expansion.

We were also able to bring back some of the big club events this year, most notably the Small Business Christmas Party. This is not only a big fundraiser for the club, but also an event that many community members look forward to. We are excited to continue this tradition into the coming years.

As a non-profit society, we continue to look for grants to support our operations. While not all applications were successful, we were able to learn a lot from the feedback given and are now working on streamlining our process for these applications.

Now that we are moving into our next season, we are continuing work on many policies, including our athlete protection policy, codes of conduct, conflicts of interest, and more. We are also focusing on longer term strategic planning and program growth.

Our current Board has been a pleasure to work with. I want to give a special mention to our Secretary, Nicole Lavoie, who also chairs our Policy and Governance Committee. Much of the work done this year could not have been done without her expertise and commitment. I also want to give special mention to our Gym Manager, Keira Almas, who works incredibly hard to make my job easy!

We know that clubs like ours don't work without volunteers; whether you are vacuuming carpets, taking in can and bottle recycling, building trampolines, or sitting on the Board, you are a valuable part of this community. We are grateful for your continued support, and look forward to working together!

2023-2024 GENERAL MANAGER ANNUAL REPORT

Terrace Peaks Gymnastics Club had a successful 2023-2024 season. It was our 2nd season back from Covid and the 1st season back for our competitive program. Our focus for 2023-2024 season was to continue to rebuild programs and adjust class schedules to maximize gym time and space as well as staff availability.

Terrace Peaks was in strong financial position going into the 2023-2024 season as such fees for recreational classes, drop-ins, and camps were not increased. Only the fees for rentals were increased by 10-13% to be more in line with other community rentals. Fees for competitive programs were also increased ~15% after 4 years of no increases.

We did not receive the BC Community Gaming Grant due a surplus in the financials. The Board of Directors did approve using some of the surplus on much needed computer and network as well as new equipment, the majority of which arrived at the end of June. We ran several fundraisers including Mom's Panty, Purdy's, Epicure, Ascent Coffee, World's Finest Chocolates, and a 50/50 Raffle.

Through viaSport grants, we were able to train several coaches in various coaching courses. 2 coaches took Gymnastics Foundations Artistic, Gymnastics Foundations Active Start, and Competition 1, 1 coach took both Gymnastics Foundations Active Start, and Competition 1 and was fully certified Gymnastics Foundations Artistic, and one coach took Competition 1. We also hired one new coach who is now trained in both Gymnastics Foundations Artistic and Active Start. We also had 4 of our coaches take the Xcel judging course.

I have been in the position as full-time General Manager for one full season now. While we are still short-staffed, I feel like we are making our way to back full operations, delivering quality programs and excellent customer service. This season we restructured both our Active Start and Parkour programs with new names, curriculum, certificates, progress reports, brag tags, and stickers. The new structure for both programs has had lots of positive feedback.

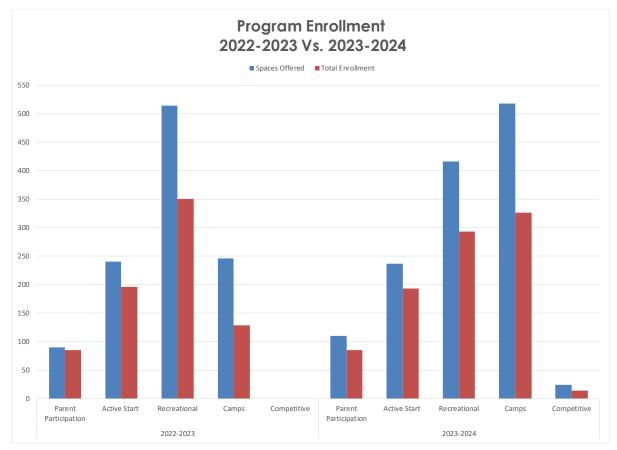
Below is a comparison of registration numbers from this season to the previous year.

Registration numbers have been fairly stable. Fall registration spaces are higher as there are more camp spaces we are able to offer during that session. Winter and Spring session we typically lose participants to other sports. Summer 2022 we hadn't reopened from Covid so weren't able to offer camps. Registration numbers don't include our drop-in programs.

Aside from camp spaces being the biggest difference from the 2022-2023 season, recreational programs had a big drop in total spaces offered (almost 100 less spaces) due to coach availability and the addition of competitive programs. However, the percentage of spaces filled was still approximately 70% in both years.







Terrace Peaks partnered with Engage Sport North to run free Active Star drop-in for 0-5 year olds during the Fall and Winter sessions. Engage Sport North did not have any funding to continue the program for the Spring session, but we are hopeful to partner with them again this coming season. We have also been looking other funding options to subsidize drop-in programs as there is definitely a need.

In addition to our regular programs, we ran several successful club events. After 4 years, we were able to host the Annual Halloween Party again. This event saw 77 member and non-member kids participate in a fun afternoon of crafts, haunted house, and free play in the gym. Our competitive athletes hosted a hot chocolate and bake sale at the Eat, Shop & Be Merry event downtown. The competitive athletes used the funds raised from this event to purchase their new team bodysuits. We also brought back the Small Business Christmas Party which we co-hosted with Free Elements Dance Studio. The event hosted 300+ adults over 2 nights. This season's Year End Event "The Greatest Show" had a packed viewing area and lots of athletes showing off the amazing skills they had learned all year. The dunk tank and cake walk fundraisers during the event were really popular. Many thanks to our membership for donating treats and to the Thornhill Fire Department for filling up the dunk tank.

In closing, I would like to thank my amazing staff of coaches as well as the board of directors and parent volunteers who continue to work hard every day on behalf of the athletes of Terrace Peaks. We are very fortunate to have such a dedicated group who all contribute to the success of our club. Thank you to everyone for another great year!

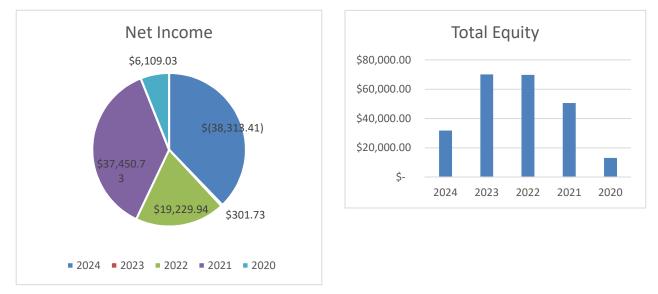

2023-2024 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Terrace Peaks Gymnastics Club had a deficit of \$38,313.41 for the 2024 fiscal year end with a total equity of \$31,773.07, 55% lower than the previous year (\$70,086.48). This was due to the significant amount (\$70,079.85) of much needed equipment and facility upgrades that were made over that last two years using the surplus accumulated from the previous 4 fiscal years.



This fiscal year's focus was to maximize grant revenue potential by adoption best practices to ensure accuracy and efficiency of financial reporting.

A summary of changes from fiscal year 2023 to fiscal year 2024 are as follows:

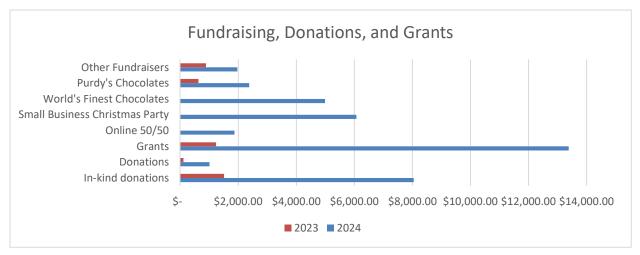
- Total program revenue went up 22%, a difference of \$54,814.23
- Total payroll expenses went up 50%, a difference of \$110,423.30
- Total professional development expense went **up 80%**, a difference of \$6,326.99
- Total other expenses went **up 16%**, a difference of \$20,050.62

The 2023/2024 financial year changes were impacted by increased number of programs offered, competitive pay rates for employees, the addition of health benefits for full-time employees, and investment in increased training for staff.

This year, the net fundraising, donation, and grant income **increased by 90%** from the prior period. Grants were used for professional development, lighting upgrades, and subsiding programs. Fundraising revenue was used to purchase new equipment. The in-kind donations came in the form of printing, labour & building supplies, prizes, and staff education.







The budget for Terrace Peaks' 2024-2025 Fiscal Year was approved by the board of Directors on May 31, 2024.

Preparation of the budget took into consideration a more accurate prediction of program revenue, fundraising capacity, and the return of the Annual Invitation Meet.
